From the Principal

Thank you for your sacrifices and investments of your time, your talent, and your treasure in making Palma School a great success. Dear People of Palma,

Thank you for reading this monthly newsletter. Try as I might to keep my communication with you brief, I could not limit myself to one page this month. This is a beautiful time of year, and I beam with pride at our Chieftain students, our highly committed teachers, staff and coaches, and so many supportive parents, volunteers, benefactors and proud alumni. Palma School is a place where <u>The Essential Elements of an Edmund Rice Education</u> thrive, where we "celebrate the value and dignity of each person and nurture the development of the whole person," where we "collaborate and share responsibility for the mission," and where we "pursue excellence in all endeavors" (*Essential Elements* V, VI, and VII). Thank you for your sacrifices and investments of your time, your talent, and your treasure in making Palma School a great success.

October Month of the Rosary Catholics have a strong devotion to Mary, the Blessed Mother of God, and especially through the holy rosary. Some have described praying the rosary as a spiritual weapon to counter the powers of darkness. Others depend on it for daily prayer and tranquil meditation, both public and private. It is often used to center families grieving the loss of a loved one, particularly in the afternoon/evening prior to a funeral Mass. The rosary is not a form of idolatry; people don't use the rosary to pray to Mary. Rather, it is preferred to think of the rosary as an instrument for meditation that empowers us to pray with and through Mary. The rosary invokes the Mother of God to pray with and for us as we meditate on the sacred mysteries of the Gospel that surround the infancy and early life of Jesus (the Joyful Mysteries), Jesus' Passion and death (the Sorrowful Mysteries), the Resurrection of Jesus (the Glorious Mysteries), and the ministry of Jesus (the most recent Luminous Mysteries). As a mantra of repetitive prayers are recited (the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Glory Be), believers meditate on these mysteries of the Gospel in order to engage the mind and soul for communion with God.

The Palma Family could use your prayer. We are beyond blessed, and yet we are burdened with many needs as well. I also ask that you keep me and all whom I serve here at Palma in your prayer. To facilitate some opportunities to gather in prayer, I am inviting anyone willing and able to join me in prayer on the first day of each week of classes throughout October in our Bl. Edmund Rice Chapel for 20-25 minutes just after the last class of the day is dismissed. This way, even parents who pick up their sons can join us if they so choose. All are welcome to join me in the chapel:

If you cannot be with us physically at any of the above times, perhaps you might consider praying from wherever you are in spiritual union with us — even at the above times? Please join me in commitment to prayer in a special way this month in solidarity with Christ, his mother Mary, and the strong legacy of rosary prayer among Catholic schools.

Palma Parking Lot Pick-up/Drop-off Most parking spots on campus are assigned during the school year. So I ask parents to respect spaces reserved for those spots before 8:30am, in particular. If parents have business on campus and arrive after 8:30am please feel free to park in any unused parking spot; any student with a reserved space who is arriving later than 8:30am, will need to make adjustments, and our Director of Student Life has communicated this to our students in multiple ways and multiple times.

Also, as nice as it is seeing parents at drop-off times in the morning and at pick-up times in the afternoon, it would not hurt our young men to exercise some pedestrian safety and walk to another prearranged space along any one of our neighboring streets for their parents to pick them up. This would relieve the 12-15 minute congestion in our parking lot and along the streets at the end of each school day. And, after picking up their favorite Palma student on campus, if parents would simply turn right instead of left at the corner of lverson and Acacia Streets, drivers could further alleviate congestion at drop-off and pick-up times.

Lastly, while no one student is more important to Palma than another, no one parent is more important to Palma than another also. So why not, when dropping off your favorite Palma student in the parking lot, drive all the way in beyond the first turn, *beyond the flag pole* (red curb), and drop him off in front of the chapel? Please do not stop in the middle of the driveway upon entering our lot, and create a log jam behind you on a two-way street. Moreover, when you drive beyond the first turn in the parking lot, why not pull over along the drop-off lane and allow others to pass you on the left instead of parking and/or stopping right in the middle of the lane? Let's be cautious and prudent and kind to others.

Dress Code Perhaps one of the most defining characteristics of a private, especially a Catholic school, is the reality of an enforced dress code, if not a uniform. There are some who have advocated for monogrammed sweater vests, dress shoes, and ever more strict policies regarding haircuts and facial hair. Others would very much like to see as little regulation as possible. "These are college-bound students," they say, "Why should Palma care about collared shirts, or clean-shaven faces?" Still others who are content with Palma's current dress code, "But if only these students would tuck their shirts in!" they argue.

For many years, Palma has adhered to a **dress code**, which is clearly stated in the *Student and Parent Handbook*, and to which families consent when students are enrolled. The philosophy of Palma's dress code is well-stated: "The attire of students and the pride they show in their appearance contributes greatly to their performance in and out of class and to the respect they earn. This pride in being a gentlemen and a student at Palma is well worth preserving and fostering." Nonetheless, Palma's dress code allows for some small degree of self-expression and individuality, if not ample opportunity for discussion regarding differing points of view and individual preferences. Yet there are some who seem to never tire of pushing the limits — testing school authority. Some brashly ignore policy, and others think so highly of themselves for evading a watchful eye, if even for a moment.

I hope I never tire of the need to deal with issues regarding dress code. Yes, there are days when administrators and teachers "pick and choose their battles" regarding dress code enforcement, but there is something so healthy about this struggle between an adolescent who craves his independence and the adult who must provide the parameters and subsequent consequences for those who go too far. It is a very human desire to rebel, and even more so a teen's desire, to do what *he* wants. But perhaps it is equally important that the threshold for that rebellion be a safe one. And if that threshold is merely a student's attempt to evade the dress code, then I am happy to enter that struggle anytime and anywhere. I find it far better to work at keeping students in compliance with *dress code*, than to confront the tragic realities of illegal and illicit rebellion that so often plague many others beyond our campus.

Thank you for reading. Thank you more for your support. Remind your son: Be a leader. Be a Chieftain! And let's mentor that.

CSF california scholarship Federation



CSF stands for the California Scholarship Federation, whose mission is to recognize and encourage academic achievement among students in California. There are approximately 1500 chapters in schools throughout the state, and each chapter is composed of students who meet CSF eligibility requirements. Eligible students become members by submitting applications based on their semester grades, with good behavior another factor for qualification. Membership is for one semester, and membership drives are held each semester within established periods dictated by CSF bylaws.

Congratulations to the students below who had spring 2023 semester grades and behavior that qualified them to apply for membership and who also met the deadline for submitting an application. Students must reapply each semester they are eligible; the next application period will be in February based on the current semester's grades. Students can earn Life Membership by earning membership during four semesters in grades 10 through 12, one of which must be based on grades earned during senior year. Holy day of obligation


The next holy day of obligation is All Saints Day on November 1, 2023 in the Blessed Edmund Rice Chapel during periods 1-3. All are welcome.

Your clearance is ready for review by Palma School once you have reached the "Confirmation Message" page. YOU ARE NOT CLEARED YET. Palma must review and clear you. An email notification will be sent once you have been cleared for participation.

Financial aid presentation for seniors and their parents in December

Palma and Notre Dame parents will be invited to attend a Financial Aid Presentation in December. The FAFSA will be making its new debut in December this year instead of October. The FAFSA is undergoing many changes. However, parents and students are encouraged to create their FAFSA IDs prior to the release of the new FAFSA. Please create your FSA ID prior to our presentation.

- Create your FSA ID Both the student and their parent need to complete this process to electronically sign the FAFSA. The California Dream Act application includes the prompts for setting up a State Student Aid PIN for electronic signatures.
- 2. You can go to the FAFSA link now and create your ID: https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch

Other aid forms required by private colleges

Seniors applying to private colleges and universities should ensure that they complete all financial aid applications required by the school. **Some private colleges require applicants to complete and submit the CSS Profile. For many colleges this form is due in early**

November. This form can be completed online at https:// cssprofile.collegeboard.org. Colleges that do not require the CSS Profile often require applicants to complete other university-specific financial aid forms. Check with the Admissions and Financial Aid offices at the private colleges to which you are applying. Failure to do so could reduce the amount of financial aid you might receive.

Optional digital PSAT/NMSQT testing for grades 10-11

Sophomores and juniors who opted to sign up to take the new digital PSAT/NMSQT this month will be testing in Brother Dunne Hall on Friday, October 13th. They will begin the test at 9:00am.
