Academic Profile for SY 2021-2022

Established in 1951 by the Congregation of Christian Brothers, Palma School is a private, Catholic college-preparatory school for boys. Known internationally as educators, The Congregation of Christian Brothers was founded in 1802 by Brother Edmund Ignatius Rice. Palma has built itself a reputation as a leader in the development of the whole person and is one of the leading private secondary schools in the state of California. Students are accepted into Palma through a competitive application and testing process. Nearly 100% of our graduating seniors continue their education at some level of post-secondary education. Approximately 460 young men are currently enrolled at Palma School in grades 7-12.

Palma Graduation Requirements To graduate from Palma High School a student must complete a minimum of 240 credits within a four-year curriculum. Typically, classes are worth five credits per semester. Minimum requirements by subjects are as follows:

Scholar Programs Three Scholar programs have been designed to provide recognition for graduates who have met the following requirements: STEM+ requires a A- grade or higher in: 1) AP Statistics and/or AP Calculus; 2) Java Programming Honors, CAD or Intro to Engineering; 3) two or more of AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science, AP Physics 1 and/or AP Physics 2;. It also requires a cumulative GPA of at least 4.0. Excellence in the Humanities requires a A- grade or higher in: 1) at least one of AP European History, AP Psychology, AP Studio Art, Jazz Ensemble, Advanced Senior Theology, Speech/Creative Writing or Another approved Humanities Elective; 2) All of the following AP World History, AP U.S. History, AP U.S. Government & Economics Honors, AP English Language and AP English Literature. It also requires a cumulative GPA of at least 4.0.

Certified Bilingual requires scoring 3 or higher on the AP Exam or at least 650 on the SAT subject exam or grade A- or higher in each of 6 semesters of a language and enrollment in the AP level of that language. In addition, a cumulative GPA of 4.0 in 8 semesters of English must be maintained.
