From the Principal

Dear People of Palma,

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday this weekend and will culminate with Easter Sunday. Latin for the transliteration “three days,” the Church celebration of the Easter *Triduum* is the holiest time of the year. Beginning with Holy Thursday, we strive to imitate Christ’s loving service with an evening ritual “washing of the feet” as we celebrate the first Eucharist instituted by Jesus in the upper room with his apostles. By night we venture into the spiritual gardens of Gethsamane where we remember Jesus’ agony, his very human fear, his loneliness and abandonment. On Good Friday, we memorialize Jesus’ sacrifice for each of us with the Stations of the Cross, communion service, and even the seven last “words” of Christ on the cross for nearly six hours on that Friday almost 2,000 years ago. On Holy Saturday, we wait in prayer and anticipation for the Easter Vigil — the holiest Mass of the year on Saturday evening/Sunday morning — the triumphant celebration of Christ’s victory over death through his resurrection!

I admit that I am a church junkie during this special time! I love the pageantry, the liturgy, and the wonderfully rich traditions of the Easter *Triduum*. There is something so powerfully humbling and so baroque about the suffering, death and resurrection of our Savior. It is quite easy to find God on the mountain top when the view is breathtaking and the grandeur of nature is all around us. But Holy Week reminds us that God is also palpably present in the valley, in the “shadow of darkness,” in the suffering that is so characteristically human.

However powerful the theology of this reflection, the world does not stop for this holiest of weeks. Everything goes on: the regular TV programs, regular work schedules, and all the candy/Easter basket hype in our local department and grocery stores. So, if I want this to be a truly “holy” week, what will I do? We are *obligated* — *teachers and parents* alike — to bring the souls of our students/your sons to holiness. The journey is a life-long struggle filled with suffering and joy; and the journey begins with the choices we make during this most important time of their lives.

Bearing in mind the holy example of Blessed Edmund Rice, the founder of the Congregation of Christian Brothers, let us be mindful that the choices, the sacrifices, the opportunities for prayer that we cultivate this week *matter!* Happy Easter! *Go Chieftains!*

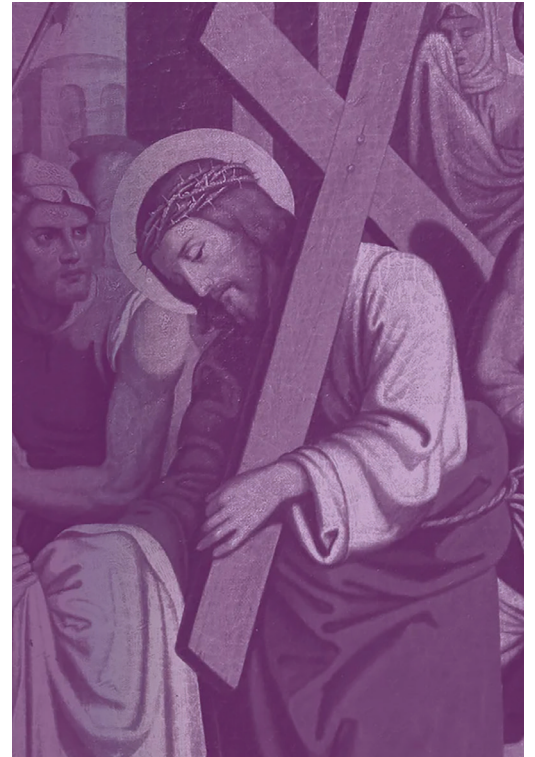

Sprinting toward a strong finish

SCOIR

Last month, sophomores and juniors were introduced to SCOIR. They created their accounts and parents were sent an email to link to their son's account. SCOIR is an amazing platform that allows students to better understand the college application process — giving them an in-depth look at their personal interests and how that applies toward selecting a major. Students are able to do a career interest inventory as well to select majors that interest them. It provides personalized college selections based on preferences, family income, and much more. Parents have unique access to SCOIR as well. As a parent, you will be able to view your son's profile, see his college list, conduct your own college searches, and suggest colleges for your son to consider. SCOIR also provides parents with financial tools so that you can get a better sense of the cost of attendance at various colleges during the selection process. The goal is that it becomes an all-in-one college hub for students to utilize for letters of recommendation, college applications, test scores, and so much more.

After the FAFSA — what happens next?

All seniors should have received their SAR (Student Aid Report) and their EFC (Expected Family Contribution). The EFC is what the Department of Education expects a family to contribute yearly to the student's college financial aid costs. This figure is calculated from the prior year's tax information. Did you know that a family could ask that the EFC figure be changed? This is done through a financial aid term, Special Circumstance. Especially now in these difficult times, many families' situation has changed drastically from last year's earnings. Has someone in your family lost their job? Has someone had his or her hours cut? Have there been unusually high medical bills? These, and more, are valid reasons for changing the EFC figures. Families must send documented, written, statements to the financial aid offices at each of the colleges/universities to which their student is applying. The Financial Aid Officers are

allowed Professional Judgment to look at each of the cases and make a determination as to allow or disallow these changes to the tax figures or other areas on the FAFSA. Remember that most financial aid offices are very small compared to the number of SAR's they must sort through to award aid at their institutions and most work is done through automation. If you are sending in documentation for Special Circumstance consideration, you must be persistent! Keep a record on what was sent, date and time of calls to the office, who you spoke with, and what information was given to you as follow-up to your request. There are free helpful web-based tools to help you better understand the financial aid process. Visit Simple Tuition (www.simpletuition.com) for more information on financial aid

CSU early start program

The CSU system has a policy known as "Early Start" requiring incoming students who do not demonstrate readiness for college level math and/or English to begin remediation during the summer before coming to the CSU. The goal is to better prepare students in math and English before their first semester, thereby improving their chances of completing a college degree. <https://csustudentsuccess.org/academic-preparation-overview>. Upon admission, CSU campuses will inform students how and where to sign-up for Early Start. Early Start math and English courses are available at every CSU campus, and online. Financial aid is available for those demonstrating need.

AWPE exam for seniors who have been accepted to the UC

UC will administer the Analytical Writing Placement Examination (AWPE) in May to students who have been admitted to the university for fall 2023 and who, by Apr. 1, have not satisfied the Entry Level Writing Requirement (ELWR) by other means. Students who have met the requirement through acceptable exam scores or transferable college-level coursework are not required to take the AWPE. For more information on the AWPE and ELWR, including access to AWPE exam reports by school or county, please visit the ELWR website below. The exam will be held on Sat. May 21st.

Students can satisfy the requirement by scoring:

- ✓ 30 or better on the ACT, English Lang. Arts or 63 or better on ACT English & Writing; or
- ✓ 680 or better on the SAT, Evidence-Based Reading and Writing; or 3 or above on either Advanced Placement Examination in English

Senior monthly reminder

- Expect to receive acceptance letters and financial aid offers by mid-April
- If you haven't visited the college you've decided to attend, do so before accepting
- Record in Naviance which college you will be attending
- Record in Naviance all scholarships you are receiving
- If you have questions about housing, talk to your counselor or call the college
- Prepare for any Advanced Placement Program (AP) Exams you plan to take
- Inform all colleges to which you applied of your admission and financial aid decisions by May 1st. Send a deposit to only one college

Junior monthly reminder

- Sign up to take the SAT in May or June
- If you plan to play a sport in college and you haven't signed up with the clearinghouse you need to do that now (www.eligibilitycenter.org)
- Continue to explore colleges and financial aid opportunities in SCOIR
- Look into summer programs, workshops, internships, or jobs.

2023 SUMMER SCHOOL @ PALMA COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

ALGEBRA 1 REVIEW

Credits: 5 (High School or Junior High)

Reviews numbers and basic arithmetic operations applied to them and proceeds through solving systems of equations and inequalities, polynomials and algebraic fractions by applying various algebraic axioms, concepts and methods. For those who failed or did poorly in Algebra I or those who wish to improve their math skills before entering school in the fall.

BIOLOGY REVIEW

Credits: 5 (High School)

This course reviews the study of energy flow, plant and animal classification, microorganisms/aspects of cell theory, biochemistry, heredity and genetics, and evolution. Designed for students who failed or received a low grade in one or both semesters of Biology.

FRESHMAN/SOPHOMORE ENGLISH REVIEW (ENG 9 & 10)

Credits: 5 (High School)

Review of college preparatory freshman and sophomore English composition and literature - specifically, of Palma's required summer reading texts. Designed for Palma students who have failed or received a low grade in English I or II and for those who need "extra help" with their summer reading or with English skills.

FUNDAMENTALS OF SPANISH

This course is for enrichment only; not for credit – 2.5 hrs for 5 weeks

This course introduces students to the Spanish language and prepares incoming students who will be taking Spanish 1 at Palma. The instructor will review the fundamentals of Spanish such as numbers, sentence structure, alphabet, and verb conjugations.

GEOMETRY (HONORS)

Credits: Honors: 10 (High School)

An intensive course to present the principles of geometry covered at Palma. This honors course is designed primarily for Palma students who wish to advance to Algebra II Trigonometry during the coming school year. This course is ONLY open to current 10th graders or above.

JHS ENGLISH/LITERATURE REVIEW (JUNIOR HIGH)

Credits: 5 (Junior High)

Reviews the principles of English composition and literature covered in the seventh and eighth grade at Palma Junior High. Primarily designed for Palma Junior High students who have failed or received a low grade in English and for those who need "extra help" with their summer reading or with English skills.

JUNIOR/SENIOR ENGLISH REVIEW (ENG 11 & 12)

Credits: 5 (High School)

Review of college preparatory junior and senior English composition and literature - specifically of Palma's required summer reading texts. Designed for Palma students who have failed or received a low grade in English III or IV and for those who need "extra help" with their summer reading or with English skills.

MATH 7 (JUNIOR HIGH)

Credits: 5 (Junior High)

This course reviews the principles of general math covered in the seventh and eighth grade at Palma Junior High. Primarily designed for Palma Junior High students who have failed or received a low grade in General Math or those who wish to improve their math skills before entering school in the fall.

PRE-ALGEBRA

Credits: 5 (High School or Junior High)

Review of the principles of pre-algebra covered at Palma. Primarily designed for Palma students who have failed or received a low grade in Pre-Algebra or those who wish to improve their math skills before entering school in the fall.

RELIGIOUS STUDIES REVIEW

Credits: 5 (High School or Junior High)

Independent study by contract to make up Religious course or credit shortages in required subjects. Enrollment is restricted to Palma students. The students will meet once each week, by appointment, with the instructor.

SPANISH 1, 2 OR 3 REVIEW

Credits: 5 (High School or Junior High)

This course is to review the principles of college preparatory Spanish 1, 2 or 3 covered at Palma. Designed for Palma students who have failed or received a low grade in Spanish 1, 2 or 3; or those who wish to improve their language skills before entering school in the fall.
