Dear People of Palma,

Perhaps more important than ever the holidays afford us opportunities to be boldly deliberate in our celebration of Jesus as the reason for the season. Our innately human hopes for what is good, true, and beautiful are fully realized in our annual rejoicing of the incarnation of He who is *the way, the truth, and the life:* Jesus Christ. We are reminded that Christmas, Christ's Mass, *begins* on the eve of December 24, and continues long past the sales, and the street Santas, and the parades. Some local radio seems to go "all in" on round-the-clock Christmas songs the moment that Thanksgiving is over — and it's great. But why must it all stop the moment Christmas for the next several weeks into January, even. And that we must prepare for Christ's coming at Christmas Eve with a countercultural practice — to be still, to relish in peace, and quiet — to do *Advent!*

Advent is a season of the Church wherein we commit ourselves to *quiet* our busy lives; we spend some time in solitude; we pray with more intensity; we give to those who need; we hope for Christ's *coming* with an expectant fervor that prepares us to receive him. Being still, quiet, to relish in peace is perhaps harder than ever before. We live in a culture that puts TVs in every room and our cars, streaming from our every personal device we can hold, smart phones in our pocket that dominate every moment when we are alone. How can we prepare for his coming into our homes, into our hearts (now and at the end of time), and into the specialness of this season that makes giving so much richer amid so much noise?

Advent is a new season in the Liturgical Calendar, from the Latin *adventus*, which means "coming." This is a time of *expectant waiting*. It is represented by a blue-purplish color that represents the night sky before the dawn of the rising sun. A time to remember the coming of *the Son*, who is the light that extinguishes the darkness, as the first chapter of John proclaims. With each new Sunday, we light candles in an advent wreath of evergreen rich with symbols to remind ourselves of this most important truth.

Let us take time this Advent to pray *with* our families and our loved ones, and to put some perspective on the commercial frenzy that secularizes the holiness of this time. Let us take time to enter into *communion* with one another — at the Mass, in our giving and sharing, in the time we spend truly being present to one another. One need not be Catholic, or even Christian, in order to recommit oneself to this terrific recipe for joy and happiness. We welcome and cherish our students of all backgrounds, blessed abundantly with varied customs and beliefs. And we challenge them to give of themselves through their knowledge, service, and leadership. The Lord Jesus wouldn't have it any other way. Merry Christmas, Palma! Go *Chieftains*!

Finals Are Here

Semester exams will soon be upon us, with finals for grades 7 through 12 beginning on Wednesday, December 15 (please see the note regarding grade 6 at the bottom). Exams are arranged by class period over three minimum days. Teachers will proctor their own finals, and students will take exams in the room where the class is usually held. Students are required to stay for a minimum of one hour but have nearly two hours to complete the exam. The final-exam grade is separate from the two quarter grades and may count for up to 20% of the semester grade depending on the level of the class. Teachers will be preparing students throughout December to be sure they understand the weight and format of the final for their specific classes. The schedule is as follows.

Please note that Thursday, December 16, is <u>not</u> a Late Arrival Schedule.

Students do not take finals during exam week in PE, health, and art and music classes. The two AP classes meeting during zero period will take their exams during the last two days of classes on Monday, December 13, and Tuesday, December 14. If a student does not have an exam during a given period, he is not expected to be on campus. For instance, a junior high student who has PE during period 2 would not need to be at Palma during the period 2 exam block on Wednesday; likewise, a high school student in Digital Art period 3 would not be expected to be here during the period 3 block on Thursday. **Parents should review their son's schedule to know when he will be taking his exams.** Teachers will also relay the schedule to students in class and post times on homework pages. A number of common areas will be open and supervised for those who wish to remain on campus to study before or after exams.

It is extremely important that families plan for their sons to be here throughout finals week, as teachers will not be administering final exams before that week to accommodate travel plans. If an unplanned absence occurs, such as due to illness, students will need to make independent arrangements with their teacher for a make-up, perhaps during the afternoon on the exam days if possible. Students unable to take finals during exam week will make them up during the first two days of the new semester when classes resume in January (Thursday, January 6, and Friday, January 7).

The Cislini Study Center will be open December 15 through December 17 from 7:30 to 1:00, and the cafeteria will provide *a la carte* items for purchase all three days.

Note to Parents/Guardians of Students in Grade 6: Because sixth graders do not take final exams, they will have full days of school on Wednesday, December 15, and Thursday, December 16 (8:15 to 2:45); on Friday, December 17, the last day before the Christmas break, sixth graders will have a minimum day, with dismissal at 12:20 along with the rest of the school.

Hello Palma Community,

I hope that your Thanksgiving break was enjoyable with family and friends and that you are ready to be back at school for our final three weeks! Over the past 70 years, Palma has been at the forefront of Catholic education in the Salinas Valley. We strive to set ourselves apart from other area schools, both public and private.

Over the past two years, there have been many ups and downs during the pandemic. One of Palma's many goals this year was to get our boys back on campus and acclimate them once again to the Palma culture. During this time, Palma has allowed some leeway regarding tardiness and dress code (illegal hooded sweatshirts, hair length, and shaving).

Beginning with our return to school for the second semester, Palma will be more consistent with enforcing these guidelines as written in the handbook. As a school, Palma believes in the value of a well-groomed student and the discipline it provides. In addition, a Palma student is on-time for classes, and with that timeliness, he can effectively complete assignments and stay focused during his classes.

Beginning with the start of the next semester, Palma School will make every effort to partner with parents in being more consistent about dress code, grooming, and arriving to class on time. As always, Palma will have clean polos, shorts, pants, and sweatshirts for a student to borrow for the day for a \$1.00 rental fee. Students will need to return the clothes to Palma School washed the next day. Repeat offenders may be sent home until they can be in their proper dress code. In addition, students who miss class will not be allowed to participate in extracurricular activities for that day, depending on their missed time.

Also, beginning with the start of the next semester, Palma will start with a clean slate of tardies. A student who demonstrates six (6) unexcused tardies will be subject to disciplinary consequences. Actions could result in detention but are not limited to other disciplinary policies.

We need our parents, teachers, and mentors to partner together to raise the standard for decorum and leadership on campus and hold our students accountable to this higher standard. The attire of students and the pride they show in their appearance contributes greatly to their own performances in and out of class and to the respect they earn. This pride in being a gentleman and a student at Palma is well worth preserving and fostering.

Palma School Oress Code

<u>Dress Code</u> The Palma dress code is in effect on the Palma campus from 7:30 A.M. to 3:30 P.M. The attire of students and the pride they show in their appearance contributes greatly to their performance in and out of class and to the respect they earn. This pride in being a gentleman and a student at Palma is well worth preserving and fostering. The Palma dress code applies to all Palma students, including those students who have the privilege of representing Palma in an academic / extracurricular setting or in the wearing of a Palma uniform on an athletic team, even during vacation times of Thanksgiving, Christmas, Winter Break, and/or Easter. Palma Pride in student conduct and appearance is on display for all.

- 1. Camouflage clothing of any kind will not be permitted. Camouflage sweatshirts, shirts, pants, shorts, backpacks, etc., are not permitted for students to wear at Palma during school hours.
- 2. Button-down or zip flannel shirts, with or without hoods, cannot be worn as jackets or outerwear at Palma during school hours.
- 3. Shirts are to be of the polo style variety and size-appropriate; no other button-down shirts are permitted, unless worn with a tie and the shirt is tucked in; undershirts are not to be observed at the bottom of the un-tucked polo- styled shirt. Polo shirts worn over hooded sweatshirts are <u>not</u> permitted.
- 4. Pull-over sweat shirts (hoodies) are permitted only if they 1) prominently bear the official, Palma logo/monogram and/or are "Palma issued" or 2) display the name of an accredited college/university, and 3) are size appropriate. Pullover sweaters/jackets that are half/quarter/full zip are permitted.
- 5. No denim/jeans, pants or jackets <u>or their look-alikes</u>; only khakis-styled slacks, cords or Dockers-styled slacks, sizeappropriate, are allowed and are to be worn at the waist; dress shorts or cargo shorts (not athletic, beach, or play shorts) may be worn in place of the usual school dress slacks. Sweats or golf rain pants are not permitted at any time.
- 6. Footwear should be <u>neat and clean</u>. They may be formal, semi-formal, or athletic. Sandals, slippers, moccasins, or fullsized boots are not allowed; socks must be worn so as to be clearly visible.
- 7. Hair styles should always be clean and neat and well-groomed, not extending below the top of a normal shirt collar nor below the ear, nor below the eyebrows, not too short (no # 1 cuts), not too long, with no striping, no shaved and/or hair engraving, no ponytails, no other extreme hair styles (i.e. no skin-cuts, no mohawks, no excessive hair heights, no braids, no "cornrows", no "manbuns", etc.), and hair must be the student's natural color. <u>Students are to start each day on campus clean-shaven</u>; sideburns are not to go beyond the bottom of the earlobe; beards and goatees are not permitted. Students who do not meet these requirements may be: 1) suspended until properly groomed; and/or 2) may be fined a penalty of \$1.00 for any/each infraction.
- 8. Hats, hoods, and beanies (stocking caps) are not to be worn on campus; the Director of Student Life will permit exceptions where reasonably justified by cold weather. No head/hair bands may be worn during the academic school day.
- 9. Jewelry, studded belts and/or wrist bands, expensive watches, etc., should not be worn or brought to school. Earrings and/or other body piercings (nose, lip, tongue, eyebrow, etc.) and/or tattoos are not to be worn on campus or by a Palma student in or at a school-sponsored event, activity or athletics.
- 10. Clothing worn at Palma is not to carry inappropriate messages or be of the types that reflect commercial businesses, sex, drugs, alcohol, or gang activity or be suggestive, lewd, sexist, or culturally insensitive in appearance and/or words. This includes clothing, whether it is worn outside or visible under a shirt, anytime on campus or at a school activity, including events off the Palma campus.
- 11. Undergarments are not to be purposely exposed.
- 12. Students participating in physical education classes are required to wear and maintain a clean Palma P.E. uniform (shirt and shorts) in class and are encouraged to wash up at the conclusion of the class.
- 13. Student book bags and/or backpacks are to be maintained in a clean and graffiti-free manner.

It is the responsibility of each student to follow the Palma School Dress Code and the responsibility of parents to be aware of how their son leaves home for school or school-sponsored events. In the case of individual students, the final judge of respectability and compliance is the Administration. If you or your son finds this dress code in conflict with your family/religious beliefs, please contact Mr. Noroian right away to appeal to him for his authorization of possible exceptions.

Violations of this dress code are subject to discipline, which may include detention up to and including immediate suspension from school.

High school students who took the PSAT/NMSQT (National Merit Scholar Qualifying Test) last October will be able to access their scores on-line beginning December 7th in their College Board account. Scores will be uploaded into their Naviance account the first week of December.

Students are able to link their PSAT scores directly to free testing materials from Khan. Many of the recent changes to the SAT make it more similar to the ACT, and so even if a student plans on taking the ACT, the test prep materials from Khan should still prove to be very helpful.

Tips for student athletes

When it comes to athletic scholarships and college sports recruiting, it is important for you to become familiar with the rules and regulations surrounding the various college associations, conferences, and divisions. Violation of the rules, even while still in high school, can result in ineligibility in your future athletic career. Your first task should be to determine which associations (NCAA, NAIA, and NJCAA) your prospective colleges and universities belong to, and then carefully review those group's websites.

College-bound student-athletes preparing to enroll in a Division I or Division II school need to register with the NCAA Eligibility Center to ensure they have met amateurism standards and are academically prepared for college coursework. Before you can make official visits or sign a letter of intent you must be registered.

Attention seniors

Many colleges/universities have a January 1st deadline. Please make sure you have requested letters of recommendations for your common app. schools and that you have met with your counselor before you go on Christmas vacation. Once again, your deadline is our deadline. Do not assume your teachers and counselors will be available to write letters of recommendations during their vacation, many will be out of town. So please plan ahead.
