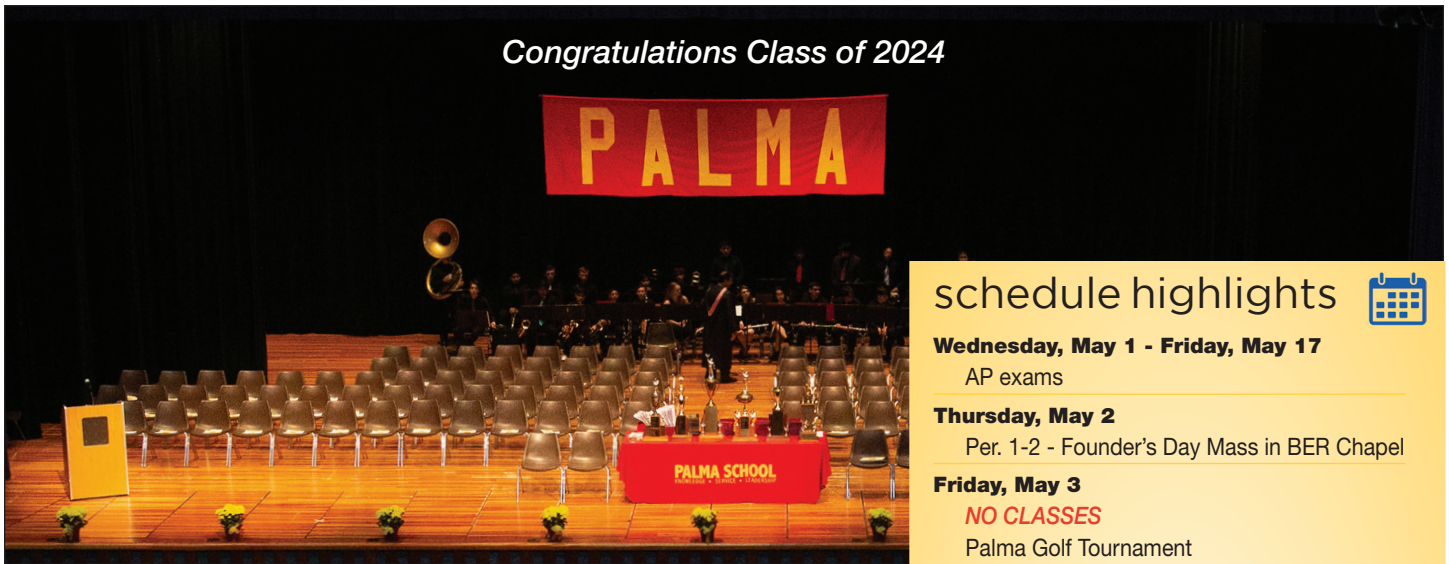

## *Congratulations Graduates!*

### **Charles B. Runnels Youth Citizenship Seminar (YCS)**

Congratulations to Kianno Philpot Montano '25 for being selected to represent Palma at the annual Charles B. Runnels Youth Citizenship Seminar at Pepperdine University. YCS is a five-day seminar where students interact with today's leaders, explore current national and global topics, discuss constructive solutions to critical issues, share memorable moments with peers, and make lifelong friends. Candidates for this program represent students of bright promise.



### **D's in college prep courses just won't cut it!**

Four-year colleges and universities will only accept grades of "C" or better to meet college prep course requirements for admission. If your son is planning to attend a four-year college, he must make-up any deficiencies prior to graduation. Students taking summer school courses to make-up D's and F's are reminded that passing a 5-credit course during summer school will only replace one 5-credit semester grade (not the entire year). In other words, a student failing both semesters of Biology would need to register for (and pass) 10 credits of Biology prior to graduation. Also, remember that colleges require incoming freshman to have completed at least two years of the same foreign language. This means that a student who completed one year of Latin and one year of Spanish has not met that requirement. The CSU and the University of CA require completion of one year (10 credits) of a visual or performing art prior to graduation. Palma students now have a number of options for accomplishing this requirement. One more reminder—scholarships are still available out there, and many of our students are highly competitive. Scholarships come in many forms and sizes. Not all scholarships are based solely on grades and/or financial need. The Guidance Office posts information on all scholarships we receive in Naviance and in SCOIR. Many students may not be aware that they are eligible to apply for scholarships. Scholarships can be based on a wide range of criteria including academics, athletics,

leadership, career interests, writing skills, ethnic background, religious affiliation, or any combination of the preceding. One can also use the internet to check out some of the outstanding FREE scholarship search sites like [www.fastweb.com](http://www.fastweb.com). This and other financial aid and college related links are indexed on the home page of your Naviance Family Connection account at <http://connection.naviance.com/palma> or in your SCOIR account at <https://app.scoir.com/signin>.

### **Tips for student athletes**

When it comes to athletic scholarships and college sports recruiting, it is important for you to become familiar with the rules and regulations surrounding the various college associations, conferences, and divisions. Violation of the rules, even while still in high school, can result in ineligibility in your future athletic career. Your first task should be to determine which associations (NCAA, NJCAA, etc.) your prospective colleges and universities belong to, and then carefully review those group's websites.

### **Senior monthly reminder**

- Record in SCOIR which college you will be attending.
- Record in SCOIR all scholarships you are receiving.
- If you have questions about housing, talk to your counselor or call the college.
- Prepare for any Advanced Placement Program (AP) Exams you plan to take.
- Inform all colleges to which you applied of your admission and financial aid decisions by May 15th. Send a deposit to only one college.

### **Junior monthly reminder**

- Sign up to take the SAT test in June. The CSU/UC are not requiring these tests for admission. However, many private institutions are requiring them. You can register for the SAT in mid-May for the fall. They will be offering one test each month from August-December.
- If you plan to play a sport in college and you haven't

signed up with the clearinghouse, you need to do that now ([www.eligibilitycenter.org](http://www.eligibilitycenter.org))

- Continue to explore colleges and financial aid opportunities.
- Look into summer programs, classes at a community college, community service, internships, and/or jobs.

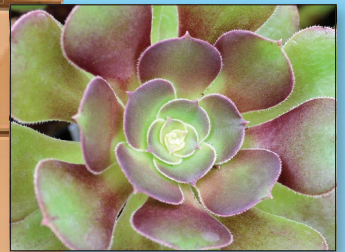
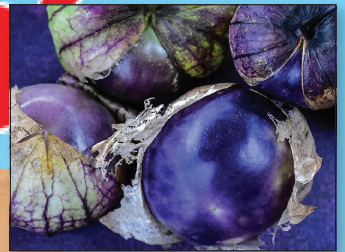
## Look for the yellow bins in front of the school

Palma Parents' Club will sort and organize donated items and resell them at discounted prices at our Back-to-School Palma Closet Sale in the beginning of next school year. Textbooks will be available to reserve and purchase earlier in the summer.



Students from the 6th grade and Nature and Ecology Club planted and cared for vegetable, flower, and succulent varieties. All plants were grown in No. 1 nursery containers and may contain one to several seedlings. All plants are priced below wholesale at \$3 per can or 10 for \$25 when you buy in bulk. Quantities are limited and vary for each selection, so priority will be given to the orders that come in first.

All plants were grown organically in premium potting soil blend and watered with rainwater harvested from the Life Lab area. All succulents were propagated by students from existing succulent stock. This year, students helped to complete the raised garden beds, lined pathways, and mulch the Life Lab area. The Life Lab is 90% complete and boasts a rainwater collection system that can store 4,000 gallons of water to be used in the dry months. Students have been busy this year.

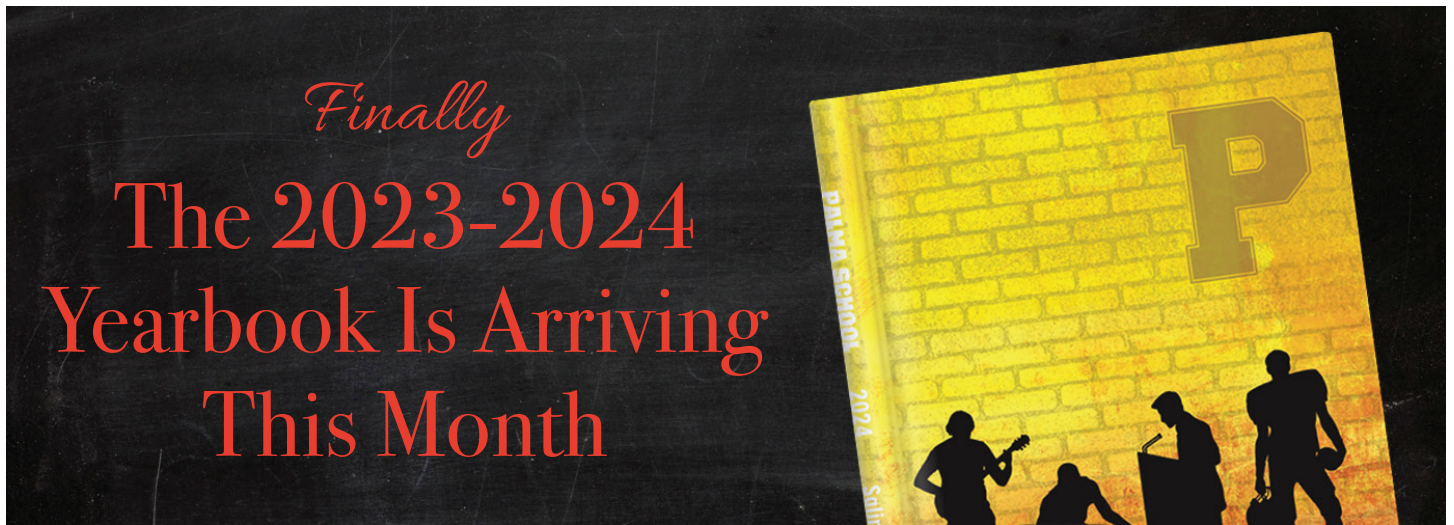

# 2024 SUMMER SCHOOL COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

## ALGEBRA 1 REVIEW

*Credits: 5 (High School or Junior High)*

Reviews numbers and basic arithmetic operations applied to them and proceeds through solving systems of equations and inequalities, polynomials and algebraic fractions by applying various algebraic axioms, concepts and methods. For those who failed or did poorly in Algebra I or those who wish to improve their math skills before entering school in the fall.

## BIOLOGY REVIEW

*Credits: 5 (High School)*

This course reviews the study of energy flow, plant and animal classification, microorganisms/aspects of cell theory, biochemistry, heredity and genetics, and evolution. Designed for students who failed or received a low grade in one or both semesters of Biology.

## FRESHMAN/SOPHOMORE ENGLISH REVIEW (ENG 9 & 10)

*Credits: 5 (High School)*

Review of college preparatory freshman and sophomore English composition and literature - specifically, of Palma's required summer reading texts. Designed for Palma students who have failed or received a low grade in English I or II and for those who need "extra help" with their summer reading or with English skills.

## FUNDAMENTALS OF SPANISH

*This course is for enrichment only; not for credit – 2.5 hrs for 5 weeks*

This course introduces students to the Spanish language and prepares incoming students who will be taking Spanish 1 at Palma. The instructor will review the fundamentals of Spanish such as numbers, sentence structure, alphabet, and verb conjugations.

## GEOMETRY (HONORS)

*Credits: Honors: 10*

An intensive course to present the principles of geometry covered at Palma. This honors course is designed primarily for Palma students who wish to advance to Algebra II Trigonometry during the coming school year.

## JHS ENGLISH/LITERATURE REVIEW (JUNIOR HIGH)

*Credits: 5 (Junior High)*

Reviews the principles of English composition and literature covered in the seventh and eighth grade at Palma Junior High. Primarily designed for Palma Junior High students who have failed or received a low grade in English and for those who need "extra help" with their summer reading or with English skills.

## JUNIOR/SENIOR ENGLISH REVIEW (ENG 11 & 12)

*Credits: 5 (High School)*

Review of college preparatory junior and senior English composition and literature - specifically of Palma's required summer reading texts. Designed for Palma students who have failed or received a low grade in English III or IV and for those who need "extra help" with their summer reading or with English skills.

## MATH 7 (JUNIOR HIGH)

*Credits: 5 (Junior High)*

This course reviews the principles of general math covered in the seventh and eighth grade at Palma Junior High. Primarily designed for Palma Junior High students who have failed or received a low grade in General Math or those who wish to improve their math skills before entering school in the Fall.

## PRE-ALGEBRA

*Credits: 5 (High School or Junior High)*

Review of the principles of pre-algebra covered at Palma. Primarily designed for Palma students who have failed or received a low grade in Pre-Algebra or those who wish to improve their math skills before entering school in the fall.

## RELIGIOUS STUDIES REVIEW

*Credits: 5 (High School or Junior High)*

Independent study by contract to make up Religious course or credit shortages in required subjects. Enrollment is restricted to Palma students. The students will meet once each week, by appointment, with the instructor.

## SPANISH 1, 2 OR 3 REVIEW

*Credits: 5 (High School or Junior High)*

This course is to review the principles of college preparatory Spanish 1, 2 or 3 covered at Palma. Designed for Palma students who have failed or received a low grade in Spanish 1, 2 or 3; or those who wish to improve their language skills before entering school in the fall.
