From the Principal

I am genuinely moved on a regular basis by our students, their families, our alumni, teachers and coaches.

Miracles are happening all the time here at Palma and through Palma to the community beyond.

Dear People of Palma,

The month of November always reminds me of my need to communicate *gratitude* more often with others. I find that a true attitude of gratitude requires time. Time is a precious thing. And there seldom seems to be enough of it — *time* — to reset my disposition, to be thoughtful and reflective, to empathize with the efforts that are being made by those around me, and then to invest myself in a moment to express my gratefulness to another person. Maybe this is why I am such a fan of the holiday season fast approaching, where the calendar affords us an excuse to carve time out of our busy lives to rededicate ourselves with gratitude.

I confess that I need to continually recommit myself to expressions of gratitude. Research argues that our health of mind, body and soul would benefit from an ample dose of it. This would be a delightfully infectious gift to ourselves and to others, and we can do it by simply being more present to those with whom we interact every day. So, what is it that keeps me from starting and ending my days with gratefulness for life's gifts? It would seem that the adversary of gratitude is *busy*-ness! We are dutiful, highly committed, vocation-driven parents who work hard at every facet of our lives, and there are many who depend on us — families, co-workers, friends, neighbors, even the stranger on the street begging for mercy and compassion. But we are plagued by the tyranny of the urgent. Stopping for a moment to be fully present to another with a disposition of gratitude may be simple, but it is not always easy. And this, perhaps, is why it has never been *more* important.

I am genuinely moved on a regular basis by our students, their families, our alumni, teachers and coaches. Miracles are happening all the time here at Palma and through Palma to the community beyond. Yes, we are busy doing great works. But do we give pause to reflect with an attitude of gratitude? What are we truly teaching one another when we don't make time for it? More importantly, what are we teaching our young men? The holidays can be very difficult for people who do NOT have some of the most basic securities to which we are all truly entitled: food, shelter, clothing, even fellowship. Couldn't we be more grateful with one another?

This November of thanksgiving and through the subsequent holiday season, I pray that our students and so many more young men and women beyond Palma experience the wonder of their worth; that they may know with confidence that they truly matter! I pray that we, the adults in their lives, model this with a deep sense of gratitude for their place in our world, and for our place in service to them and the mentoring of them. I am reminded that life brings no guarantees to wait for tomorrow to be grateful. So, with this in mind I say thank you, Palma Family! And have a blessed and Spirit-filled Thanksgiving holiday! - Click "For Students & Parents" and select "California."
- Returning users log into their existing account. New users need to create an account. Please register with a valid Parent/Guardian email address as the username and generate a password.
- Select "Start Clearance Here" and complete all of the required fields.
- Sign the documents by typing in an EXACT match of what is on the Student & Parent/Guardian page.
- Make sure to click "Save & Continue."

Your clearance is ready for review by Palma School once you have reached the "Confirmation Message" page. YOU ARE NOT CLEARED YET. Palma must review and clear you. An email will be sent once you have been cleared for participation.

College deadlines are coming fast!

Important information regarding the launch of the 2024-25 FAFSA® form

There are major changes and improvements coming to the 2024-25 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. As a result, the new form will be available in December 2023, not October 1. The launch date will apply only for the 2024-25 FAFSA form. The changes include

- expanded eligibility for federal student aid
- a more streamlined application process

Make sure to create your StudentAid.gov account — and remember your username and password so you can access and submit the 2024-25 FAFSA form when it becomes available in December.

Here are links to create your student FSA ID, Determine Dependency Status and parents create a FSA ID. **Both** the student and the parent must create an FSA ID in order to sign the FAFSA for submission.

Please create your FSA IDs before the Financial Aid Presentation on December 13th at 5pm in BDH.

Other aid forms required by private colleges

Seniors applying to private colleges and universities should ensure that they complete all financial aid applications required by the school. Some private colleges require applicants to complete and submit the CSS Profile. For many colleges this form is due in early November. This form can be completed online at http://profileonline.collegeboard.com/index.jsp. Colleges that do not require the CSS Profile often require applicants to complete other university-specific financial aid forms. Check with the Admissions and Financial Aid offices at the private colleges to which you are applying. Failure to do so could reduce the amount of financial aid you might receive.

The college essay

This is your opportunity to tell the college about yourself — your hopes, ambitions, life experiences, inspirations.

Take your time on this assignment. Be open. Be reflective.

Find your individual voice and express it honestly. Do's and Don'ts for your application

- Do use unique personal anecdotes. You want your application to stand out!
- Do get to know your universities and what they stand for before filling out your applications.
- Do follow any directions given in your application, such as adhering to word or page limits. Read the question thoroughly and don't elicit information that was not requested.
- Don't procrastinate. Last minute, rushed applications may not reflect your best work.
- Don't lie. Period. Any fabricated grades or omitted grades, test scores, leadership positions — admission counselors will find out and it will certainly jeopardize your acceptance and scholarships.

- Create your FSA IDs for the FAFSA
- Complete the CSS/Financial Aid Profile if it is required by any of your selected colleges.

Before we shave anyone's head, we want to assure students and parents that all necessary permissions will be sought to ensure everyone is on board with this fundraising effort.


