



Palma School App

Tips for student athletes

When it comes to athletic scholarships and college sports recruiting, it is important for you to become familiar with the rules and regulations surrounding the various college associations, conferences, and divisions. Violation of the rules, even while still in high school, can result in ineligibility in your future athletic career. Your first task should be to determine to which associations (NCAA, NJCAA, etc.) your prospective colleges and universities belong, and then carefully review those groups' websites.

Scholarships and financial aid for college

Scholarships come in many forms and sizes. Not all scholarships are based solely on grades and/or financial need. The Guidance Office posts information on all scholarships we receive in SCOIR. Many students may not be aware that they are eligible to apply for scholarships. Scholarships can be based on a wide range of criteria including academics, athletics, leadership, career interests, writing skills, ethnic background, religious affiliation, or any combination of the preceding. One can also use the internet to check out some of the outstanding FREE scholarship search sites like www.fastweb.com.

Seniors need to finalize their college list

September is the time to revisit your college list. Think again about what is important to you in choosing a college — location, majors, size, school values, diversity of student body, finances, etc. Adjust your list so that all of your prospective colleges are ones you'd be happy to attend. Now check that you have included institutions from all three tiers. Your list should include a couple of "reach" schools, then several "possibles" and finally a larger group of "probables." "Reach Schools" include those at which most accepted students have higher GPA's and/or test scores than you. A college that accepts less than 20% of applicants also should be considered a "reach" for nearly all students. "Possibles" are those colleges which regularly accept students with grades and test scores similar to yours. "Probable" colleges are those at which your test scores and GPA would place you in the top quarter of the entering class.

Counselors will be meeting with all high school students this month

Counselors will be meeting with all high school students this month to create their SCOIR accounts. Meetings will take place during the student's Theology or PE class. Counselors will meet with seniors every Tuesday during their Theology class during the first semester.

Dear Palma Senior Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

The 2023 Palma Yearbook staff is ready to start working on this year's high school yearbook — with much more time than last year! The cost of this all-color book will be \$100. To ensure that proper corrections and proofing can be made, please be sure to respect the deadline dates for each section. I will communicate with you on these deadlines via the monthly editions of the Palma Newsletter. If you misplace any forms, they will be available online on the Palma website.

Senior Baby Ads

The first major deadline is the "Senior Baby Ads." The "Baby Ads" deadline is **Friday, November 3, 2023.** If you need ideas concerning the "Baby Ads," check the last few yearbooks to see how others have done them and start collecting your photos and creating your design. Senior Portrait

The second deadline that is extremely important is the Senior Portrait. Each senior is expected to have a professional portrait taken. The photographers listed on the flyer on page 11 are preferred photographers for taking Palma Senior Portraits. We have had quality problems in the past with people sending in nonprofessional portraits. Please use a professional photographer for your son's Senior Portrait. SENIOR PHOTOS

The Palma senior portrait must be a formal photograph. Please do not submit non-professional shots. Any candid snapshots will not be used. The photo will need a head and upper body shot. Full-body shots will not be permitted. Please note, your son should be the major focus in the photo so please limit the amount of background featured in the photo (i.e. props such as planes, tractors, trees, etc.). Your son must be in a collared shirt and/or Palma Letterman, including no earrings, no jewelry, and his hair must be his natural color and cut according to Palma dress code standards. All photographs will be reviewed and those photographs that do not adhere to Palma dress code rules will be returned and will not appear in the yearbook. Some examples of acceptable photos are featured on this flyer. The senior portrait is due **Friday December 1**, **2023 and can be sent to me directly at cjimenez@gopalma.org**
